A resolution of the Collin County Commissioners Court opposing HB 23.

Whereas, the Legislature has given counties limited authority to regulate plats, infrastructure, and flood plains;

Whereas, Collin County is responsible to require new developments to comply with state law and county regulations, and Collin County staff currently reviews all development for compliance;

Whereas, HB 23 would prohibit Collin County from requiring a developer to receive approval from the County for development documents and development inspections;

Whereas, HB 23 supplants governmental authority with private sector contractors by allowing developers to use a third-party to review and inspect their development rather than county employee review;

Whereas, HB 23 would prohibit the Commissioners Court from disapproving a development if the documents and inspection were conducted by a third-party;

Whereas, HB 23 would allow any potential development in Collin County to proceed without County oversight by using third-party reviewers rather than county staff;

Resolved, that the Collin County Commissioners Court opposes HB 23.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried by a majority of the court members in attendance during a regular session on Monday, April 7, 2025.
