SPLIT: The proposed boundary line continues south along Alma Dr. to Barton Creek Ln, west on Barton Creek Ln to Bellehaven Dr., north on Bellehaven Dr. to Seabrook Dr., and east on Seabrook Dr. back to Alma Dr.


