Project Summary & Lifesaving Impact*

Collin County Animal Services does not have a spay/neuter budget that is provided by the county. We rely 100% on donations for this fund. This grant would allow us to continue increasing our positive outcomes through vetting and preparing for adoption.

What programs are you most proud of?*

We are most proud of the progress we have made with our medical program in ensuring every animal is vaccinated on intake and re-vaccinated on schedule. We also have improved both our foster program tremendously. This program directly allows us to maintain a higher positive outcome by giving us more space in the shelter for the incoming animals as well as providing more information about the individual animals for their future adopters.

We have also focused on fundraising and events to increase awareness of the shelter. Our most successful was a 5k run that has now become an annual event.

In what areas is there room for improvement within your organization?*

What activities and/or processes lack effectiveness or could be better executed?

We could still use improvement in staff retention which leads to an improvement in consistency of operating procedures. As we train our staff to perform tasks and processes more effectively and to completion, it is imperative that we keep these staff to maintain consistency. We must create an environment that is beneficial for the employee and one that they want to stay in.

What other work is currently happening in your community that can support these efforts?*

There are plenty of continuing education courses that can assist with training of staff as well as management training for staff retention.

What obstacles do you face that might hinder your project?*

We do not have a full-time veterinarian on staff and we contract with 2 different vets. At times, scheduling and ensuring we are able to vet everything in a timely manner can be challenging. We also have a limitation on space and therefore have to make critical decisions that impact our lifesaving abilities despite all attempts at adoption, rescue and foster.

What shelter data are you using to inform your project?*

Our data shows that we have performed 1249 spay/neuters on a combination of dogs/cats over FY25. We would like to improve that number to increase our life-saving numbers overall. The grant funds will be used for payment of our contract veterinarians as well as supplies required to perform the surgeries. In supplementing our donations, this decreases the need for staff to be focusing on fundraising and that time can be better spent on events and interactions that directly lead to positive outcomes for the animals in our care.
