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Additional Organization Information

1. What is the organizations mission statement and when was it created or last revised?

The mission of the North Texas Veterans Treatment Court (NTVTC) is to restore the lives of justice-involved veterans through accountability, structure, and compassion—providing access to mental health, substance use, and rehabilitative services that promote long-term stability and reintegration.

Established in 2013 and revised in 2024, the mission reflects the court's commitment to evidence-based interventions, trauma-informed care, and a coordinated multidisciplinary approach to supporting veterans in their recovery journey.

2. How did your organization determine the need that this grant proposal will address? What modalities did it use to gather the data and how did it assess the information to ensure the need is present?

The program identified the need for continued and expanded treatment services through data analysis, stakeholder collaboration, and veteran feedback.

Data Sources: County CSCD records, VRSS veteran identification reports, and local jail screening results. Modalities Used: Veteran focus groups, staff and judicial interviews, and community partner input (probation, VA Reentry, and local behavioral health providers).

Findings: The analysis showed a consistent increase in referrals involving co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders, with nearly one-third of justice-involved veterans lacking access to consistent behavioral health treatment.

This data supports the ongoing need for comprehensive, court-connected therapeutic interventions and case management.

3. How many grants and total funding has the organization been awarded the current calendar year? :

The program has been awarded 1 Veteran Court grant this current calendar year totaling \$400,000 in FY2025.

4. List the top two funding organizations/agencies, grant(s), award amount, brief discription of project.

Texas Veterans Commission – Veterans Treatment Court Grant (\$400,000): This grant supports case management, mental health coordination, and program oversight for the North Texas Veterans Treatment Court serving five counties. Funds sustain licensed clinicians and staff providing evidence-based services addressing trauma, depression, anxiety, and substance use disorders among justice-involved veterans.

The program utilizes DLD, SCRAM, in-home devices, and drug patch testing to monitor sobriety and accountability. Limited financial assistance is provided for housing, utilities, and transportation needs to promote participant stability.

Funding also supports operational needs including program supplies, participant uniforms, printing, web-based data systems, software licensing, and therapeutic materials such as journals and workbooks. These resources ensure trauma-informed, coordinated care and successful reintegration for veterans across North Texas.

5. Is the organization currently "doing business" with any individual(s) whom is a principal stakeholder or is related to a principal stakeholder of your organization:

No. The organization is a county-operated court program and adheres to all Collin County and State of Texas conflict-of-interest policies. No vendors, contractors, or partners have a familial or personal relationship with any principal stakeholder.

6. Does your organization use contractors to perform duties or services for beneficiaries? If yes, how are contractors vetted to ensure their reliability and safety of the beneficiary:

Due to limited funding, all program staff members are required to serve as contractors rather than county employees. With this staffing structure, although we are not able to provide benefits to staff members, we are able to allocate more resources toward direct client services and supports for program participants. This approach allows the Veterans Treatment Court to sustain essential operations and ensure that participant needs remain the top priority.

All staff contractors are hired through a formal selection process conducted by Judge Roach, which includes a review of qualifications to ensure alignment with position requirements and the Veterans Treatment Court mission. Comprehensive background checks are completed prior to onboarding, and all contractors are required to maintain appropriate licensure and ongoing military informed training.

7. What types of services does the organization currently provide to the community in the proposed service area?

The North Texas Veterans Treatment Court serves Collin, Rockwall, Kaufman, Fannin, and Grayson Counties by providing court-supervised treatment and recovery services for justice-involved veterans whose offenses are linked to trauma, mental health challenges, or substance use stemming from their military service. Through individualized case management, counseling, and substance use treatment, the court helps veterans achieve stability and accountability while reducing recidivism. Direct client services funded through this grant include counseling, substance use treatment, transportation, and limited financial assistance for housing and utilities. By addressing the root causes of criminal behavior and supporting veterans in rebuilding their lives, the program enhances public safety, strengthens families, and contributes to a healthier, more resilient community.

3. Provide a summary of the service(s) your Organization proposes to provide to clients through this grant\*

Through this grant, the North Texas Veterans Treatment Court will provide comprehensive, coordinated services to justice-involved veterans addressing both mental health and substance use needs. Services will include individualized case management, mental health coordination, and evidence-based therapeutic interventions.

The program will utilize continuous alcohol and drug monitoring tools to support accountability and promote sustained sobriety. Participants will also receive direct assistance and referrals for housing, employment, and essential needs to strengthen stability and successful reintegration into the community.

4. Describe how your organization will ensure that beneficiaries reported to FVA are unduplicated. :

All new referrals are verified through intake documentation, including name, date of birth, last four digits of Social Security number, and DD-214 verification. Case managers conduct an additional review to confirm that no active or past participant records exist prior to entry.

Monthly data audits are completed by administrative staff to ensure the accuracy of reporting and to confirm that each individual is counted only once per grant cycle. This process guarantees that all beneficiaries reported to the Texas Veterans Commission are unique and accurately represented.

5. Describe how the eligibility verification documents are securely maintained :

Eligibility verification documents are securely maintained on the Collin County network, which is encrypted and accessible only to authorized Veterans Treatment Court staff. Documents received in paper form are scanned and uploaded to the participant's confidential file in TheraNest, and hard copies are securely shredded. Access to files is permission-based and monitored for compliance. All staff and contractors complete annual data security and confidentiality training and follow HIPAA and county privacy standards to ensure all records are maintained securely and confidentially.

The Veterans Treatment Court utilizes a comprehensive, multi-pronged outreach strategy to engage both the justice system and the broader community. The program actively conducts presentations to local courts, probation departments, and law enforcement agencies to raise awareness and strengthen referral pathways. Through partnerships with local veteran organizations and Combined Arms, the court expands its reach and fosters collaboration across multiple support networks. In addition, the program distributes brochures in local jails and courts.
