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Additional Organization Information

1. What is the organizations mission statement and when was it created or last revised?

VALOR transforms the lives of justice-involved Texas veterans within a secure Intermediate Sanction Facility by replacing conviction with purpose. Through structured evidence-based treatment, accountability, and peer support, we provide access to lifelong opportunities for rehabilitation—empowering veterans to heal, rebuild discipline, and return to their families and communities with dignity, stability, and honor.

2. How did your organization determine the need that this grant proposal will address? What modalities did it use to gather the data and how did it assess the information to ensure the need is present?

The VALOR Program conducts individualized needs assessments through its case management team to identify risk factors affecting each veteran's stability. Assessments frequently reveal that, during periods of custody, veterans face the imminent loss of housing, transportation, phone connectivity, or storage for personal belongings. Approximately 30% of veterans sent to VALOR are unsheltered or at risk of losing their housing while in the program. These disruptions create significant barriers to successful reentry and long-term rehabilitation, reinforcing the need for financial and housing assistance upon release.

3. How many grants and total funding has the organization been awarded the current calendar year? :

Texas Veterans Commission – Veteran Mental Health Grant (\$270,000):

Funds licensed clinicians, case management, program management, transportation to treatment and evidence-based mental health and substance use treatment for justice-involved veterans in custody. Supports trauma-informed programming focused on post-traumatic stress, depression, anxiety, and substance use disorders.

Community Justice Assistance Division (CJAD) – Community Corrections Facility Grant (\$1,600,000):

Provides operational funding for bed space, medical care, and facility operations for incarcerated veterans in the VALOR Program. Supports the only veteran-specific Intermediate Sanction Facility (ISF) in Texas, ensuring a secure and rehabilitative environment.

Office of the Governor – Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) Grant (\$256,502):

Funds the Clinical Director, part-time Intake Coordinator, and additional clinicians to ensure consistent therapeutic coverage based on program capacity. Supports continuity of care and access to clinical services for veterans referred to the VALOR Program statewide.

Total Funding: \$2,126,502.

4. List the top two funding organizations/agencies, grant(s), award amount, brief description of project.

Texas Veterans Commission – Veteran Mental Health Grant (\$270,000):

Provides funding for two licensed clinicians, case management services, program management and evidence-based therapeutic programming designed to address trauma, depression, anxiety, and substance use disorders among justice-involved veterans in custody.

Community Justice Assistance Division (CJAD) – Community Corrections Facility Grant (\$1,600,000):

Funds the Community Supervision and Corrections Department to support bed space and medical care for incarcerated participants enrolled in the VALOR Program located within the Collin County minimum security facility.

No. The organization complies with all Collin County and State of Texas conflict-of-interest policies. No contractors, vendors, or staff have personal or familial ties to principal stakeholders.

Yes. VALOR utilizes contractors for program management, clinical services, and case coordination. All contractors undergo **criminal background checks through the County and Sheriff's Department**, verification of licensure and insurance and overall review by Judge John R. Roach, Jr.

7. What types of services does the organization currently provide to the community in the proposed service area?

VALOR provides trauma-informed rehabilitation and reentry services to in-custody justice-involved Texas veterans, including clinical therapy, case management, and housing support.

3. Provide a summary of the service(s) your Organization proposes to provide to clients through this grant*

This grant will fund a contracted VALOR Program Director and provide direct financial assistance to veterans in need of rent, mortgage, utility, and temporary housing support. Funds will stabilize veterans during transition from custody, prevent homelessness, and sustain recovery through housing and utility assistance.

4. Describe how your organization will ensure that beneficiaries reported to FVA are unduplicated. :

All beneficiaries are assigned a **unique client identification number** in TheraNest and verified through name, date of birth, and last four digits of Social Security number. Data is reviewed monthly by administrative staff to prevent duplication and ensure accurate reporting to FVA.

5. Describe how the eligibility verification documents are securely maintained :

All eligibility documents, including DD-214s, identification, and verification forms, are securely stored on the Collin County network and accessible only to authorized personnel. Paper files are scanned into TheraNest and shredded immediately after upload. Access is controlled by user permissions and monitored to ensure HIPAA compliance.

▼ Marketing and Outreach

1. Describe the organization's marketing and outreach plan. How will your organization conduct marketing to mass audiences promoting grant-funded services in the selected service area (County or Counties)? What marketing techniques will your organization be using to promote grant funded services?

Outreach for VALOR's financial and supportive services is conducted through case management coordination and judicial partnerships rather than public marketing campaigns. Case managers work directly with courts, probation departments, jail reentry teams, and the VA Reentry Program to identify eligible veterans in need of housing or financial assistance. Information about available services is shared through referral packets, discharge planning sessions, and professional briefings with community partners to ensure that resources are directed to veterans at the point of need.

The VALOR Program accepts referrals from all 254 Texas counties, providing case-managed assistance to justice-involved veterans through court-approved placements and statewide coordination with probation departments and Veteran Justice Outreach officers.
