RE: Recommendations for FY 2025 Non-Profit Grant Awardees

On January 16, 2025, the Collin County Health Care Advisory Board met and reviewed five applications from non-profit organizations requesting funding to provide health care services. Funding of **\$140,000 for non-profits** was approved during the FY 2025 budget process. As directed by the Board of Trustees, the Healthcare Foundation Advisory Board made their funding recommendations, based on the following criteria:

Types of services limited for funding:

- Sick medical visits (including specialist visit, provided by a licensed health care provider);
- Laboratory and medical imaging services;
- Prescription drugs (generic when available); and

Recipients of services must be Collin County, Texas residents who are:

- U.S. citizens or Legal Resident Aliens with more than 40 working quarters of U.S. employment; and
- Uninsured and have household incomes at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Awarded amounts for each agency were determined based on the percentage of past awards utilized within the last two grant year cycles, as well as reviewing the requested dollar amounts and its percentage of the agency's total annual budget.

After lengthy discussion and consideration, the Healthcare Foundation Advisory Board unanimously voted to recommend \$135,000.00 in funding for the following non-profit agencies based on previous performance and utilization of past funds awarded. The Advisory Board also recommended that the remaining unallocated amount of \$5,000 be held in contingency for non-profits if critical funding needs are identified during the fiscal year.



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Carevide - \$20,000 (of \$30,000 requested) for sick medical visits, laboratory services, medical imaging, and prescription drugs. Awarded amounts for each agency were determined based on the percentage of past awards utilized within the last two grant year cycles, as well as reviewing the requested dollar amounts and its percentage of the agency's total annual budget.

Catholic Charities of Dallas (Previously named Community Health Clinic) - \$40,000 (of \$50,000 requested) for patient clinic visits and specialist visits. Awarded amounts for each agency were determined based on the percentage of past awards utilized within the last two grant year cycles, as well as reviewing the requested dollar amounts and its percentage of the agency's total annual budget.

Health Services of North Texas - \$11,200 (of \$50,000 requested) for sick medical visits, laboratory, and immunization services. Awarded amounts for each agency were determined based on the percentage of past awards utilized within the last two grant year cycles, as well as reviewing the requested dollar amounts and its percentage of the agency's total annual budget.

CommonGood Medical (Previously named Hope Clinic of McKinney) - \$50,000 (of \$49,990.50 requested) for medical visits. Awarded amounts for each agency were determined based on the percentage of past awards utilized within the last two grant year cycles, as well as reviewing the requested dollar amounts and its percentage of the agency's total annual budget.

The Samaritan Inn - \$13,800 (of \$15,180 requested) for sick medical visits, prescription drugs, and specialist/ancillary visits. Awarded amounts for each agency were determined based on the percentage of past awards utilized within the last two grant year cycles, as well as reviewing the requested dollar amounts and its percentage of the agency's total annual budget.

If approved by the Trustees, service agreements will be sent to the non-profit organizations for signature and the service agreements will be placed on Commissioners Court for final approval.
