Commissioner Webb expressed support of the item contingent upon the condition that it be funded through forfeiture. Additionally, he requested that it be excluded from the repair and replacement list, and that all fuel and repair costs be paid from the Sheriff's forfeiture fund. Commissioner Hale asked how fuel and routine maintenance would be handled, including whether there was a budget line for gasoline, oil, and repairs. Yoon Kim, County Administrator, confirmed that all operating and maintenance expenses would be the responsibility of the Sheriff's forfeiture fund. Monica Arris, Budget Director, clarified that fuel would be issued through the County's fuel system and billed back to the forfeiture fund. Judge Hill further clarified that the vehicle would not be serviced by the County's fleet department and that repairs and routine maintenance would be performed by an outside vendor, with all related costs charged to forfeiture fund. Commissioner Fletcher asked how liability from a potential accident would be handled and whether it would be covered by the County's risk fund. Cynthia Jacobson, Human Resources Director, stated that the vehicle would not be covered for physical damage but liability claims would fall under the County's risk policy. Mr. Kim added that, consistent with prior forfeiture-funded purchases, the risk would cover claims with reimbursement considered as appropriate. With no further discussion, a motion was made to accept the item. (Time: 1:48 p.m.)

Yoon Kim, County Administrator, stated that the proposed ILA (Interlocal Agreement) with the City of Frisco involved leftover bond funds from a prior road project. He explained that the Court had asked staff to determine whether the savings should be reallocated to a higher-priority County project or remain with the City. Commissioner Webb stated that, prior to 2018, cities could redesignate savings, but the Court later decided that savings should be prioritized for unfunded County projects. Commissioner Fletcher noted that any use of the funds should align with County transportation priorities and the established project evaluation rubric, even if the funds remained with the City. Commissioner Williams emphasized that, in her understanding, the 2018 policy provided for bond savings to return to the County for evaluation across all projects. Judge Hill confirmed that the policy required evaluating all County projects and allocating funds to the highest-priority need, which may not be a City of Frisco project. The Court discussed the need to formalize the policy. Mr. Kim confirmed that staff would provide further analysis and counsel before action, and the Court agreed to hold the item (Time: 1:53 p.m.)

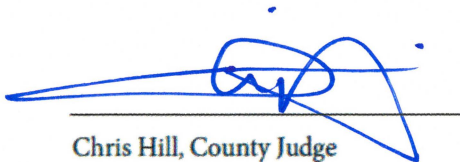
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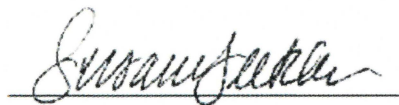
Judge Hill reconvened the meeting at 2:55 p.m.

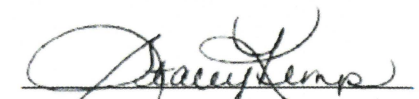
