Public comments related to an item on the Agenda.

Robert Canwright, Plano, addressed the Court regarding Agenda Item AI-59438. He stated that he had reviewed the documents posted online and did not see a connection between the materials and the agenda description, nor any indication that the County was being asked to pay legal fees. He expressed confusion over what he described as discrepancies between the documents and the item description. Mr. Canwright further voiced concern that public commentary surrounding the issue appeared emotional rather than fact-based and suggested the matter be reconsidered objectively. He also raised questions regarding judicial candidate residency and potential political implications, expressing concern that the issue could have broader political consequences. Mr. Canwright concluded by respectfully requesting that the Court reconsider its position. (Time 1:35 p.m.)

2. General Discussion Items:

Presentation, discussion and any action regarding:

a. AI-59438 Request by Judge Vincent Venegoni, Justice of the Peace Precinct 4, for the Commissioners Court to appoint and fund an outside attorney in the lawsuit styled Vincent J. Venegoni, Jr. v. Collin County Commissioners Court, et al.; Cause Number 429-09499-2025.

The Court addressed a request by Judge Vincent Venegoni for appointment and funding of outside counsel in his lawsuit against the Commissioners Court. Judge Hill noted that Judge Venegoni was not present to make the request and explained that, under Texas law, a request to appoint and fund legal counsel in an official capacity must be formally submitted to the Commissioners Court. As no such request had been made, Judge Hill stated that Judge Venegoni does not currently have County-funded legal counsel for this or any other matter.

Yoon Kim, County Administrator confirmed that the use of County funds for legal expenses is permissible only when litigation involves official actions taken in an official capacity and that Judge Venegoni had not submitted the required request to the Court. Judge Hill clarified that the materials in the agenda packet related solely to the lawsuit filed by Judge Venegoni against the Commissioners Court, which challenges the Court's statutory authority to set the County budget and disputes the budget adopted for the current fiscal year.

Commissioner Hale expressed concern regarding the lack of communication from Judge Venegoni prior to filing suit and characterized the litigation as an unnecessary use of taxpayer funds, noting that Judge Venegoni had participated in budget discussions, including an executive session, during the budget process.

Commissioner Fletcher responded to public comments, stating that while details could not be discussed due to pending litigation, the Court believed management issues within Judge Venegoni's office had created legal liabilities. She stated that the Court exercised its budgetary authority during the budget process, including reclassification of a position, and that the issues raised would be addressed through the judicial process.

Commissioner Hale further referenced publicly available employee turnover data for Justice of the Peace offices, noting significantly higher turnover rates in Precinct 4 over multiple years compared to other precincts. He stated that the Court had attempted to address longstanding administrative concerns and ultimately acted through the budget process. (Time 1:49 p.m.)

Matt Langan, Chief Deputy, requested the release of \$1,070,000 from the adopted inmate housing account to fund projected out-of-county inmate housing expenses through February 2026. He noted the FY26 Budget included \$408,800 for out-of-county housing and \$4 million in contingency funds, and that the requested amount was an over projection. Mr. Langan reported current out-of-county inmates decreased from 100 to 66 with an anticipated increase to 80. Commissioner Fletcher, Commissioner Hale, and Commissioner Webb commended the Sheriff's Office for its efforts to reduce out-of-county housing, overtime, and compensatory time. (Time 1:54 p.m.)

Tracey Homfeld, Assistant Director III, reported that P12 LLC, owner of Lot 24 Cope 2 addition, requested a re-plat of Lot 24 to establish a road easement providing secondary emergency access to the proposed development. She said the replat was initially scheduled for September 8 and again on November 3, but no action was taken to allow additional coordination with adjacent landowners. Ms. Homfeld stated that the developer proposed a gate at the northern boundary of Lot 24 in the southern part of the Peninsula 12 development to restrict through traffic and allow emergency vehicle access only. She stated that staff reviewed the replat for compliance with Texas Local Government Code Section 232.009 and applicable subdivision regulations and confirmed that notification and publication requirements were met. Ms. Homfeld requested the Court open the Public Hearing to receive testimony on the proposal.

Judge Hill opened the Public Hearing at 1:56 p.m.

Kyle Vrla, representing First Step Homes P12, addressed the Court regarding the requested re-plat for Lot 24. He stated that they met with neighboring property owner Eric Rodriguez on two occasions to discuss concerns raised in prior correspondence, particularly regarding potential traffic impacts on the cul-de-sac. Mr. Vrla explained that the request does not intend to generate additional traffic and proposed the addition of a gate to address those concerns. He further explained that the re-plat is necessary to provide a second point of access to meet current fire code requirements for emergency access. He noted that the existing COPE 2 addition was constructed in 2017 and has only a single access point, and fire code standards have since changed. The proposed emergency access would improve compliance with current fire code and would benefit both the subject lot and the surrounding COPE 2 addition by providing an additional emergency entrance. (Time 1:58 p.m.)

Leonard Smith, attorney with Pope Hardwicke Law Firm, Fort Worth, addressed the Court regarding the re-plat request. He stated that he had provided the Court and staff with information concerning Section 232.009(b) of the Texas Local Government Code, which governs the item under consideration. Mr. Smith emphasized that Ms. Homfeld confirmed the re-plat application met all applicable standards noting that such compliance renders the Court's action ministerial rather than discretionary. He stated that the statute requires the Court to approve a re-plat that meets established requirements. Mr. Smith referenced the Judge Venegoni litigation and noted any future complaints regarding the subdivision could be addressed through existing legal channels. He added that individuals opposing the re-plat retain legal recourse under current law but asserted that the governing statute requires approval of the re-plat as presented. (Time 2:00 p.m.)

With no further comments, Judge Hill closed the Public Hearing at 2:00 p.m.

Commissioner Fletcher noted this was the third discussion on the matter and said she struggled with the decision but concluded it was a ministerial duty required by statute, leaving no discretion, and therefore supported approval. Commissioner Webb agreed the action was ministerial, stated the law provided no discretion, and said he would approve despite personal objections. Commissioner Hale raised questions regarding when the matter might shift from ministerial to discretionary, after which Judge Hill held the item for executive session to consult with legal counsel. (Time 2:03 p.m.)

After returning from Executive Session, a motion was made to approve the item. (Time 3:14 p.m.)

i. AI-59359 Conference of Urban Counties Update, Commissioner, Precinct 3.

Commissioner Hale provided an update on the CUC (Conference of Urban Counties) meeting he attended as a substitute for Commissioner Fletcher. He stated that the meeting included discussion regarding paper ballot requirements and potential conflicts between federal directives and state law. He noted that depending on the outcome of pending litigation there is a possibility that the primary election could be delayed and that some jurisdictions could be required to issue separate federal and state ballots. Commissioner Hale clarified that any such ballots would occur at the same time and that Collin County would not be affected, as it is compliant with current federal orders.

Commissioner Hale further reported that the committee discussed lobbying activities and the CUCs consideration of revisiting its policy positions to better distinguish county interests from those of cities, which could result in a divergence between county and city policy advocacy. Additional discussion included TxDOT funding, emphasizing the importance of seeking formula-based funding through congressional requests rather than relying solely on grant-based funding in future transportation legislation.

Commissioner Hale also raised concerns regarding special districts formed under House Bill 4211, noting potential constitutional issues related to the First and Fourteenth Amendments. He stated that the committee agreed to review the matter further. Lastly, he reported that the committee discussed the Governor's recently announced five-point platform, including proposals aimed at lowering property taxes, with a primary focus on school taxes, and noted that additional details were forthcoming.

j. AI-59455 Regional Transportation Council monthly update, Commissioner, Precinct 4

Commissioner Webb provided an update from the recent RTC (Regional Transportation Council) meeting. He reported that Transportation Department Senior Manager, Brandon Wheeler, would be leaving to assume a position as Director of Transportation in San Antonio. He also reported the Council approved a letter to the NCTCOG (North Central Texas Council of Governments) Board for joint training efforts to help address and resolve issues between the RTC and NCTCOG. In addition, the Council approved expenditures of up to \$50,000 to retain outside counsel to advise the RTC. Commissioner Webb further noted that the Council approved participation in the electric infrastructure call for projects using federal funding to expand electric vehicle charging stations, emphasizing that Collin County received a significant share of the awarded projects, all of which will be located on public property. The Council also approved the final bundle for Round Six of the TDC (Transportation Development Credits) awards, expanding opportunities for cities and counties to receive credits to meet federal matching requirements.

Commissioner Webb reported that the Transit Vision Committee continues to make progress on developing a long-term regional transit vision over the next 25 years, with anticipated completion between April and October. He concluded by noting that work has begun on the new Regional TIP (Transportation Improvement Program) for Fiscal Years 2027–2030, emphasizing that projects must be included in the TIP to advance.

Commissioner Fletcher suggested adding a future agenda item to identify a substitute or secondary representative to attend RTC meetings, allowing them to learn from Commissioner Webb before his retirement and ensure continuity as Commissioner Webb and Commissioner Williams leave office.
