Grant Description
Specialized court program that provides services to juveniles with mental illness or intellectual disabilities. The program serves as a diversion alternative to deeper involvement in the juvenile justice system by combining judicial oversight, probation supervision, and coordinated mental health services, supported by one Juvenile Probation Officer (JPO) and one Case Manager, during a one-year grant period.

How Do You Intend to Utilize The Grant Funding
To continue funding one Juvenile Probation Officer (JPO) and one Case Manager assigned to the Juvenile Mental Health Specialty Court. These positions support supervision, case management, service coordination, court monitoring, and compliance with individualized treatment plans. Funds may also be used for allowable program-related services in accordance with TJJJ requirements.

How Will This Benefit Collin County
providing a structured diversion program for juveniles with mental health or intellectual needs, reducing reliance on detention and traditional justice processing. By leveraging state funding, the county is able to maintain specialized services, improve youth outcomes, enhance public safety, and reduce long-term system costs during the one-year grant period with no county match.
