

**A resolution of the Collin County Commissioners Court approving grant application 4245506**

Whereas, The Collin County Commissioners Court finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Collin County, that the Juvenile Mental Health Court Program be operated for the FY2026-2027; and


Whereas, Collin County Commissioners Court agrees that in the event of loss or misuse of the Office of the Governor funds, Collin County Commissioners Court assures that the funds will be returned to the Office of the Governor in full.

Whereas, Collin County Commissioners Court designates the County Judge as the grantee's authorized official. The authorized official is given the power to apply for, accept, reject, alter or terminate the grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

Whereas, Collin County Commissioners Court designates County Auditor as the grantee's financial officer. The financial officer is given the power to submit financial and/or programmatic reports or alter a grant on behalf of the applicant agency.

**Now, therefore, be it resolved** that Collin County Commissioners Court approves submission of the grant application for the Juvenile Mental Health Court Program to the Office of the Governor.

A motion was made, seconded, and carried by a majority of the court members in attendance during a regular session on Thursday, February 12, 2026.
