- b. AI-59522 Unclaimed Juror Pay Funds, Auditor.

Robert Cone, County Auditor, requested formal direction regarding the disposition of unclaimed juror payments, and explained that historically such funds had remained in the juror payment fund to offset future juror expenses, totaling approximately \$477,000 over the past 20 years. He noted the 90-day statutory period for claiming payments and highlighted the recent implantation of a new automated notification system to improve recovery of unclaimed funds.

A motion was made to adopt the current practice of retaining unclaimed juror funds in the Juror Payment Fund. (Time 1:40 p.m.)

Judge Hill stated that Collin County voters had approved a new ESD (Emergency Services District), Collin County Emergency Services District No. 1, which required the appointment of five initial board members. A motion was made to appoint Daniel Robinson, Tim Mock, Kevin McGillis, Randal Shinn, and Linda Backlund as the first Commissioners of the district. (Time 1:54 p.m.)

d. AI-59607 Regional Transportation Council monthly update, Commissioner, Precinct 4.

Commissioner Webb reported that the recent RTC (Regional Transportation Council) meeting focused primarily on the pending DART (Dallas Area Rapid Transit) withdrawal elections and a proposal to support DART member cities by reducing their required contribution from one cent to three-quarters of a cent through RTC funding over five years. He stated that the RTC approved reprioritizing \$105 million in future federal transit funds, without a specified timeline, to support connecting DCTA (Denton County Transit Authority) to the Silver Line and connecting Trinity Metro to DFW (Dallas Fort Worth) Airport. He stated the funds were already allocated for transit purposes and would be redirected over multiple years with no specific time limit. Commissioner Webb noted that acceptance of funding by the City of Plano, Irving, and Carrollton was contingent on execution of the IRA (Interlocal Agreement), and that smaller cities' participation would have minimal impact. He further reported that \$75 million in regional transportation funds would be allocated to DART over five years to support member cities and maintain participation in the system. (Time 1:52 p.m.)

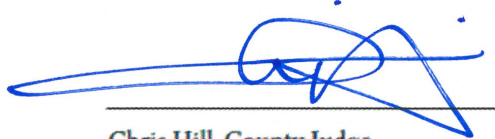
3. Executive Session Items:

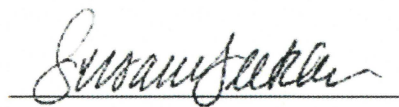
The Court did not recess into Executive Session.

Richard Hill, Farmersville, addressed the Court regarding excessive noise in unincorporated areas of Collin County. He stated that cities have noise ordinances but the County lacks authority to regulate noise below the 85-decibel threshold established in the Texas Penal Code. He reported that Representative Jeff Leach had indicated willingness to pursue legislation in 2027 to lower allowable nighttime decibel levels and that support from the Commissioners Court would strengthen the effort. Mr. Hill requested that the matter be placed on a future agenda and asked for the Court's support. (Time 1:34 p.m.)

There being no further business of the Court, Judge Hill adjourned the meeting at 1:55 p.m.

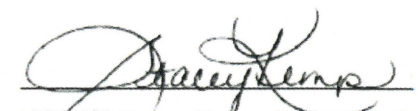
