The youth was enrolled in the Mental Health Court program, a Intensive Supervision designed to monitor compliance on a weekly basis. He was mandated to attend weekly counseling sessions and actively participate in family therapy, ensuring a comprehensive approach to his rehabilitation. A case manager was assigned to work closely with the family, providing resources and support to address any challenges that emerged. Twice during his probation, the youth was placed on an electronic monitoring program to reinforce the importance of adhering to curfews and maintaining a structured environment. Furthermore, he was enrolled in the Summit Program at the Collin County Juvenile Probation Department, which offers targeted support and intervention in a secure facility. In addition to these services, the youth benefited from the our local mental health authority services. The department has made reasonable efforts, in partnership with community resources, to facilitate the help this youth be successful in the community. The youth's probation was modified twice. The youth's probation was modified twice. He initially entered the department as an Interstate Compact Transfer from California, facing a misdemeanor charge of recklessly causing a fire to property. On May 4, 2025, he was arrested for assault causing bodily injury. He was adjudicated to probation on November 2, 2023, and placed in the mental health court program. Six months later, he was arrested again for assault causing bodily injury, leading to further modifications and an extension of his probation on April 25, 2024. The respondent's first Motion to Modify was opened on February 1, 2024, and his second Motion to Modify was reopened on December 26, 2024. The youth's third Motion to Modify was reopened on September 23, 2025.

A therapist who possesses expertise in mental illness, diagnosis, and a diverse range of therapeutic techniques will be instrumental in addressing his trauma and behavioral challenges. At just 16 years old, he is at a juncture where he needs educational support, whether through dedicated tutoring or a nurturing school environment with educators trained to assist students facing mental health obstacles. Additionally, participation in a program focused on moral recognition therapy and emotional regulation would empower him to develop coping skills and foster resilience.
