2. General Discussion Items:

Presentation, discussion and any action regarding:

a. **AI-59649** State of the District Courts presentation, District Courts.

Judge Christine Nowak, 493rd District Court Judge, stated she was proud of the District Courts' performance, noting the Judges were accomplishing more with fewer resources. (Time: 1:34 p.m.)

Judge Tom Nowak, 366th District Court Judge, reported that Collin County ranked first in Texas for disposing of cases, based on data from the Office of Court Administration, even while serving one of the State's largest and fastest-growing populations. He said the District Courts had no backlogs, moved cases rapidly to trial, and generated cost and time savings for the County and litigants. Judge Nowak noted increasing caseloads, including roughly 1,000 juvenile cases resolved in the past year, and a growing workload per judge as the population has surpassed 1.25 million. He credited the Courts' success to strong collaboration with County partners and expressed pride in their performance.

Judge Hill thanked Judge Nowak and the Republican District Judges, then asked whether 31,750 referred to filed or disposed cases. Judge Nowak confirmed it was disposed cases. Commissioner Fletcher thanked the Judges, noting that while they can control case assignments, the average of five months and six days to dispose cases highlights their hard work. She praised their efficiency with limited resources and expressed appreciation for their efforts. Commissioner Webb praised the District Judges, highlighting the average case disposal time as the most impressive statistic, and encouraged them to continue their hard work. Judge Nowak noted that while other statistics like trial frequency and trials per 10,000 residents also show strong performance, the chart highlighted the standout metric of case disposal.

Commissioner Hale asked about the impact of statutory changes on filings, such as motor vehicle cases. Judge Nowak stated that civil filings actually increased about 30% last year, noting that while the statutory cap changed, the minimum filing requirements did not, so filings remain high. (Time: 1:45 p.m.)

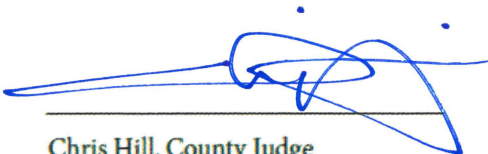

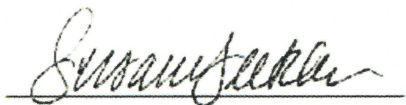

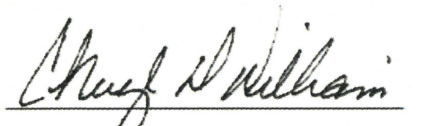
The Court did not recess into Executive Session.

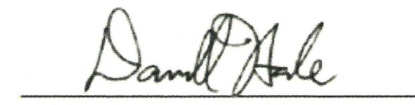
There being no further business of the Court, Judge Hill adjourned the meeting at 1:48 p.m.

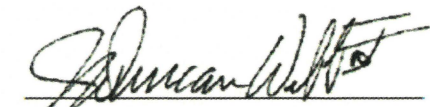

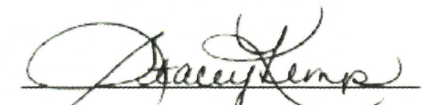
