Grant Description The Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) Discretionary State Aid (DSA) Supplemental – Body Scanners FY2026 grant provides funding to eligible juvenile probation departments to acquire and implement advanced body scanning technology. The grant is intended to improve facility safety and security by enhancing screening capabilities, preventing the introduction of weapons, narcotics, electronic devices, and other prohibited contraband into secure juvenile facilities, while promoting safer and more efficient screening procedures for youth, staff, and visitors.			
How Do You Intend to Utilize The Grant Funding Collin County Juvenile Probation intends to utilize the grant funding to purchase and implement an advanced full-body scanner for use within the secure detention facility. The scanner will be used during juvenile admissions, returns from court appearances, medical appointments, transports, and other instances where screening is necessary to detect concealed weapons, narcotics, cellular devices, and other prohibited contraband. Funding will also support installation, implementation, operator training, software, and warranty costs as allowed by the grant. The body scanner will strengthen existing security procedures while providing a non-invasive, efficient, and reliable screening process that enhances safety for youth, staff, and visitors.			
How Will This Benefit Collin County This project will significantly enhance the safety and security of the Collin County Juvenile Detention Center by improving the County's ability to detect and prevent contraband from entering the facility. The implementation of advanced body scanning technology will reduce risks to youth and staff, improve operational efficiency during intake and facility re-entry screenings, and lessen reliance on more intrusive search methods. The equipment will support a safer environment, protect County employees and residents, and align with best practices in juvenile detention by providing a modern, technology-based approach to facility security. Additionally, the system will assist the department in collecting screening and operational data that supports continuous improvement and accountability.
